DAY 01. Arrival in Johannesburg - Sandton

Arrive Johannesburg. After the airport and money changing is completed travel to our hotel via a tour of Johannesburg city and surrounds.

Overnight Courtyard Hotel Sandton.

DAY 02. Cradle of Humankind

You will be collected after breakfast for a tour to the “Cradle of Humankind” at the Sterkfontein Caves. Then visit Maropeng museum where the human life on Earth is depicted in graphic style. Enjoy lunch at Carnivores in the Cradle then spend the remainder of the afternoon shopping for souvenirs at Chameleon Mall.

Overnight Courtyard Hotel Sandton. Breakfast and lunch included.

DAY 03. Soweto and Apartheid Museum

After breakfast depart on a full day tour to Soweto. The tour includes a visit to the new Prestige Park and Orlando West, travelling past homes of the rich and famous, houses of Winnie Mandela and Archbishop Desmond Tutu. We also stop at the Mandela Museum, as well as the Hector Peterson Memorial for a glimpse into the history of SOWETO. You have the opportunity to have lunch at one of the shebeens – also described as taverns - in Soweto. After lunch we visit the Apartheid museum. Return to your hotel late afternoon.

DAY 04 Johannesburg – Tswane/Pretoria - African Safari

Today we travel to Tswane/Pretoria for a visit the Union Buildings and a drive through the city, to a private reserve where our African wildlife experience commences. Check into our lodge after refreshments we embark on a open vehicle safari to search for the Big Five (lion, elephant, leopard, rhino, buffalo) amongst a host of other wild animals. The safari continues into the evening and we search for the shy nocturnal animals such as the leopard, cheetah, hyena, etc with powerful spotlights. Return after a lifetime experience for a sumptuous dinner in the open roofed enclosure (boma) around a huge open fire – Africa style!

Overnight Wildside Luxury Tented Lodge. Breakfast, dinner included.

DAY 05 African Safari – Cape Town

An early rise for warm coffee and biscuits before another exhilarating safari and return for a late breakfast. Then we check out and return to Johannesburg and the local airport for our flight to Cape Town where we are met and transferred to our hotel for dinner (own account) and overnight.

DAY 06. Cape Town City & Robben Island

Depart at 09h00 for the morning City Tour and Table Mountain: Cape Town, Tavern of the Seas, with the majestic Table Mountain as a backdrop, is one of the most beautiful cities in the world. An electric mix of architectural styles, cobble stone streets and cultural diversity enhance the cosmopolitan ambience. Our first stop is at the Table Mountain cableway to ascend the mountain (weather permitting). Enjoy the spectacular views over the Cape Flats, Cape Town and the Cape Peninsula National Park. Some of the highlights we visit are Signal Hill, Malay Quarters, Castle of Good Hope, Company Gardens and Government Avenue, Houses of Parliament and the S.A. Museum. Then we travel to the Robben Island Boat launch area for a trip to Robben Island Museum for a tour with guides who include some ex-political prisoners who act as tour guides on Cape Town's World Heritage Site. One such guide is Lionel Davis, who, in April 1964, was sentenced to six years on Robben Island, after being found guilty of conspiring to commit sabotage. Now Lionel lives on the Island with his family and is the chairperson of the Robben Island Village Association. This afternoon, Lionel speaks evenly of his former jailers and the appalling conditions he had to endure in the early 1960s and 1970s at the Robben Island Maximum Security Prison. Guides such as Lionel bring to life a South African heritage, which speaks to all people of heroic endurance in the face of adversity and the triumph of the human spirit over evil.

DAY 07 Cape Peninsula

We depart at 09h00 for the full day Cape Peninsula Tour - The Cape Peninsula forms part of the Cape Floral Kingdom, and more indigenous plant species per square meter are found here than anywhere else on earth. The coastline of the Peninsula have more than a hundred beaches with dazzling white sands to choose from, and this tour offers magnificent viewpoints to some of them. On this round-trip of the Peninsula, we visit the following highlights: Cape Point where the two oceans meet, the fynbos rich Cape of Good Hope Nature Reserve, a visit to Boulders Beach where we can see penguins in their natural habitat, Muizenberg with its magnificent 35 km stretch of beaches, Simon's Town where the South African Navy is based, Groot Constantia the oldest winemaking centre in South Africa.

DAY 08 Cape Winelands

Dominated by Indigo Mountains, the Cape wine routes are immensely popular throughout the year. The wine lands provide wonderful opportunities for wine lovers to sample some noble vintages and explore exquisitely furnished Cape Dutch manor houses. Highlights of this tour include Paarl with its rich history of wine making and the role it played in the development of the Afrikaans language, Nederburg Estate, KWV, Franschhoek Valley where French settlers settled after fleeing persecution in France in the late 17th century, Boschendal Wine Estate, and Pniel, a village where the local people sometimes have great stories to tell. Lunch is enjoyed at one of the wine estates – try out some of the great wines! We spend the afternoon in Stellenbosch with its many historic buildings and some unique shopping opportunities. **Overnight**

DAY 09 Cape Town Townships

You will depart at 09h00 this morning for a full day tour of Cape Town Townships. Tour includes: District Six, the District Six Museum, Bo-Kaap, a visit to one of the Schools in the townships, lunch at Lelapa Restaurant, **Langa** - the Guga S'Thebe Arts & Culture Centre, Shebeen (informal pub), **Bonteheuwel**, Gugulethu Seven Memorial, Amy Biehl Memorial, Nyanga, Crossroads and Khayelitsha. Spend time at District Six Museum with guided tour provided by museum employee Joe Schaffers. This evening, the group

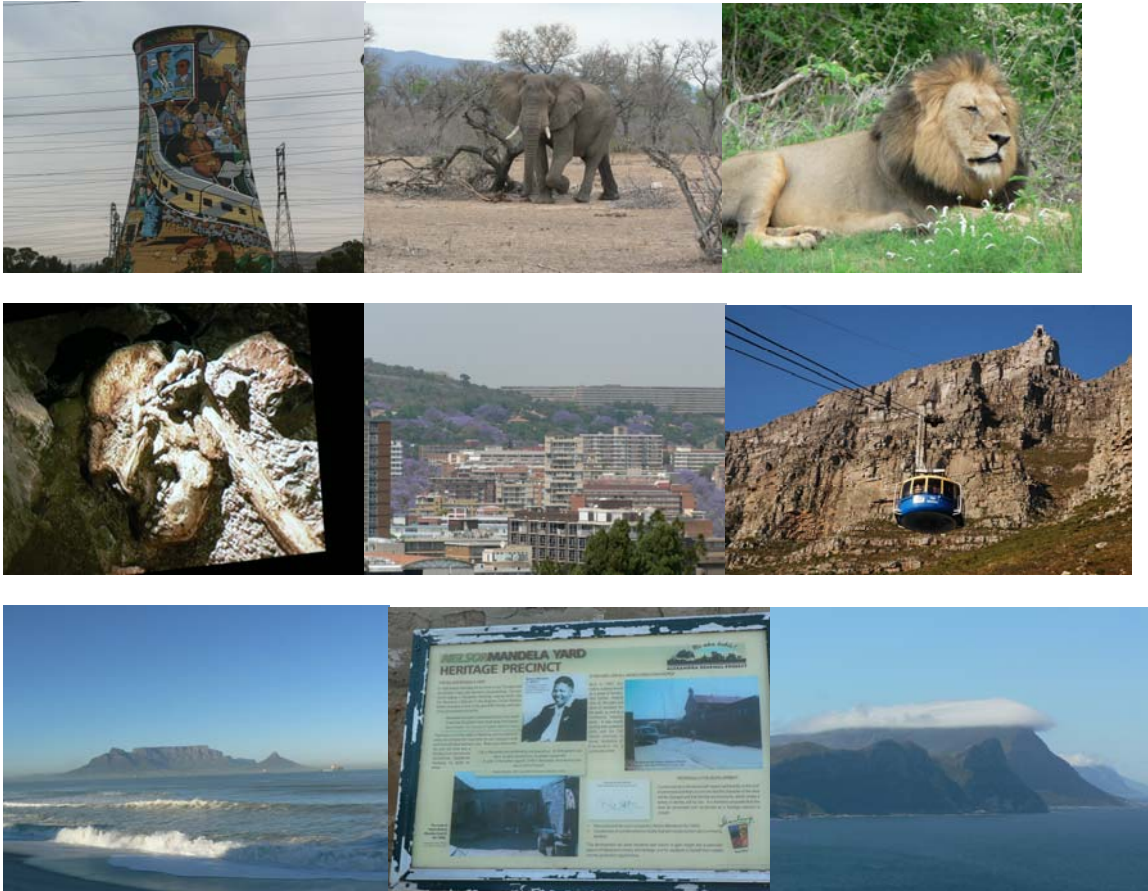
